Terms and Conditions

Making any payments (cash, credit card or otherwise) towards any tour constitutes your unconditional acceptance of all the terms and conditions stated in this tour brochure. Trinity World Tours shall be referred to as TWT within this document.

DOCUMENTS: US citizens require a valid passport. Other nationalities please inquire with the appropriate embassies. Passports must be valid for six months beyond the tour's return date.

TRAVEL WARNING: Please be advised that there is a Travel Warning issued by the Department of State for travel to Israel, the West Bank and Gaza. This warning may still be in effect on the day of your travel and cancellation for this reason will not constitute grounds for refund of the cancellation fees listed below.

REGISTRATION AND DEPOSITS: A deposit of \$400 per person is required upon registration along with a signed copy of the registration form. Registrations cannot be taken by telephone. Registrations are processed in the order received by TWT. Balance of payment is due 90 days prior to departure. Late payment is subject to \$50 late fee. Late registrations (fewer than 90 days) must be accompanied by full payment by cashiers check only (including the optional passenger travel protection program payment, if applicable), plus a \$50 late fee and are subject to availability. TWT reserves the right to cancel reservations that are not paid in full 75 days prior to departure and to charge cancellation fees/penalties indicated below. A \$25 fee will be charged on all checks returned by our bank.

CHANGES IN INVOICING: Please note that after initial invoicing, any requests for change in form of payment (cash discount vs. standard base) or in package (air inclusive vs. "land only") are subject to a \$50 per person per change processing fee.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION FEES & REFUNDS: All cancellations must be received by TWT in writing via certified mail or facsimile. TWT will process your refund, minus a cancellation fee according to the following schedule:

- 1) \$150 if cancelled at least 150 days prior to the tour's departure date;
- 2) \$300 if cancelled 149 to 90 days prior to the tour's departure date;
- 3) \$400 plus any non-refundable amounts paid to and/or penalties assessed by airlines, hotels, or other suppliers of travel services (up to the total cost of the tour) if cancelled 89 to 8 days prior to the tour's departure date;
- 4) No refunds for cancellations received within 7 days of departure date.

The above cancellation fees and/or penalties will also apply if you register for an optional extension or airline routing, and you decide to cancel or change any of these. TWT strongly recommends the Passenger Travel Protection Program (see 'PASSENGER TRAVEL PROTECTION PROGRAM' below.)

If a tour is cancelled in its entirety, full refunds shall be issued within two weeks of such cancellation. TWT shall not be held liable and hereby expressly disclaims liability for any loss, expense, damage or inconvenience caused as a result of any tour cancellation or changes made to the itinerary. 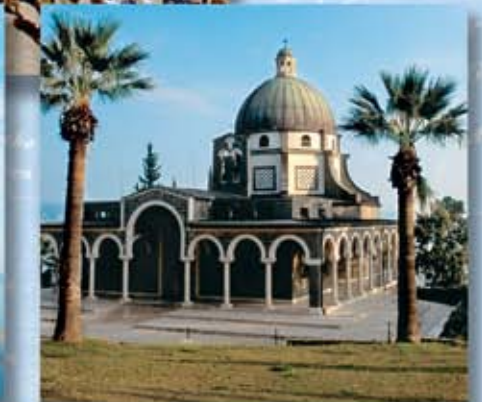

We will visit places with familiar names: Nazareth, the Sea of Galilee, Tiberias, Mt. Tabor, Bethlehem, Mount of Olives and of course Jerusalem. We will visit the place where our own patron Saint Stephen was martyred; we will go home to our roots.

Encountering Christians, who have lived in this land since the time of Jesus, as well as Jews and Muslims, we will begin to get an understanding of why this land is holy to so many. If you have ever dreamed of making a pilgrimage to the land of our spiritual mothers and fathers, perhaps this is the moment you have been waiting for. It would be an honor for us to share this deeply spiritual experience with you.

In his poem *Little Gidding*, T.S. Eliot wrote: "We shall not cease from exploration/ and the end of all our exploring/ Will be to arrive where we started/ And know the place for the first time." These words capture the essence of pilgrimage; we hope you will join us on this extraordinary journey during this most extraordinary year in our history of St. Stephen's.

Our Daily Itinerary

MON, NOV 1, DAY 1: DEPART USA: We depart en route to Tel Aviv. A Trinity World Tours representative will assist us with the check-in process. We are now on our way to the Holy Land and a life transforming pilgrimage.

TUE, NOV 2, DAY 2: ARRIVE TEL AVIV / TIBERIAS: We arrive in Tel Aviv, where our private motor coach and Christian guide will be waiting for us. The coach will take us to Tiberias in Galilee, which will be our home for the next few evenings. After some time to rest we gather for dinner and a meeting with our guide. (D)

WED, NOV 3, DAY 3: TIBERIAS: EXCURSION TO NAZARETH: Today we will visit the town of Nazareth, which at the time of Jesus' birth was probably a village of some 300 persons. The town houses the largest Christian population of any city in Israel. This was the home of Joseph and Mary and for some nearly thirty years the scene of Jesus' life. The journey begins with a visit to Mary's Well, the site of the only spring-fed fountain in the city, and most likely the place where Mary would have gone to draw water. We follow on foot the path from the well to the Church of the Annunciation. We will also visit the small museum within the walls of the church. Close by we will visit the Church of St. Joseph, built over the cave thought to be Joseph's house. We will have the exceptional opportunity to visit the fascinating archaeological dig under the Convent of the Sisters of Nazareth. This site is not open to the general public. Lunch will be served at a local restaurant. After lunch, we will visit Christ Church and Christ Church School, an important parish in the Anglican Diocese of Jerusalem. We will be sure to stop at one of the pastry shops for which Nazareth is famous and have an opportunity to visit the shops in Nazareth. We will then return to Tiberias for the evening meal. (B, L, D)

THU, NOV 4, DAY 4: TIBERIAS: GALILEE EXCURSION: Today we will make an excursion to the north of the Sea of Galilee, the area in which Jesus practiced much of his ministry. During this morning's Eucharist we remember this ministry. We will make our way up to the Mount of Beatitudes, where we read and meditate on the Sermon on the Mount. Our pilgrim meditation walk will take us the short distance along an easy walking path from the Chapel of the Beatitudes to Tabgha or Heptapegon (seven springs).

The Church of the Multiplication stands on the site where tradition says Jesus fed the five thousand. We will pause for



lunch to taste some of the local fish, traditionally called 'Peter's Fish' in memory of the Apostle Peter casting his net to gather fish.

After lunch we make our way around the shoreline to the town of Capernaum where Jesus spent about 2-1/2 years (Matt 4: 13-17). More of Jesus' miracles were performed here than in any other city. Peter lived here as well. Our day concludes with a boat ride in a replica of the first century fishing boats used by the disciples on the Sea of Galilee. We return to Tiberias for dinner and the evening. (B, L, D)

FRI, NOV 5, DAY 5: TIBERIAS / MT. TABOR / NAIM / CANA / JERUSALEM: This morning we make a stop at the Jordan River to recall how Jesus was baptized by John at the beginning of his ministry. There we renew our own Baptismal Covenant. Next we make our way to Mt. Tabor, which is the traditional site of the Transfiguration (Luke 9:28-36). Our motor coach will park in the parking lot below and we will board taxis and make the winding ascent. The basilica here is an inspiring structure. After our visit, the local Sisters invite us for a good homecooked lunch. Following our visit on Mt. Tabor we will continue on our way south, stopping in Naim where the widow's son was raised from the dead by Jesus. (Luke 7:11). We continue on to Cana, where Jesus performed his first miracle at the request of his mother [John 2:1-11]. In Cana we will visit the Franciscan chapel where Jesus began His public ministry in the Gospel of St. John. We will arrive in Jerusalem to have time to rest and to orient ourselves to the Old City. Dinner is at our accommodations. (B, L, D)

SAT, NOV 6, DAY 6: JERUSALEM: MT. ZION, ST. MARK'S MONASTERY, CHURCH OF ST. ANNE: On the eastern slope of Mt. Zion is the probable site of the Palace of Caiaphas, the high priest at the time of Jesus' arrest and crucifixion. Jesus came here from Gethsemane. We will see the steps of the old street from Jesus' time and the cell dungeon of Caiaphas where Jesus stayed. In Jesus' day this site was within the walls of the Old City of Jerusalem. (Matt 26: 57-63).

We will visit St Mark's Monastery, a richly ornamented 12th century church in Jerusalem that is traditionally believed to occupy the site of the house belonging to Mary, mother of Mark the Evangelist. The church is a possible site for the room in which the Last Supper was held, it contains a Christian stone inscription testifying to early reverence for that spot.

Next we will visit the Church of St. Anne. The church marks

the traditional site of the House of Anne and Joachim, Mary's parents. Later, we will enjoy some free time for shopping or visiting other sites, and for those who are interested, a walk to West Jerusalem which is the modern Jewish section of the city. We will return to our accommodations for dinner and the evening. (B, D)

SUN, NOV 7, DAY 7: JERUSALEM: BETHLEHEM, MT. OF OLIVES: We will begin the day in worship at St. George's Anglican Cathedral and have the opportunity to visit with the congregation in the Cathedral Close for fellowship and lunch. Next we travel to the town of Bethlehem (the name means 'house of bread'). We begin our visit at Shepherds' Field and learn about the life of the shepherd from some of the Bedouin people who will greet us in traditional fashion. The Church of the Nativity is located in Manger Square. This is the oldest church in Christendom, constructed by Constantine in AD 326 and the traditional site of the nativity. The Church contains a room where Jerome worked on the Latin Vulgate Bible. Next we will travel to the Mount of Olives to visit the beautiful little church, Dominus Flevit ("The Lord wept"). It was here that Jesus wept over Jerusalem [Luke 19:41] prior to his death.

We will then walk down the Mount of Olives to the Garden of Gethsemane, and visit the garden where the ancient olive grove still stands and the Church of All Nations where pilgrims venerate the place where Jesus prayed. We return to our Accommodations. Dinner this evening is on our own. (B, L)

MON, NOV 8, DAY 8: JERUSALEM: CITY OF DAVID, WESTERN WALL, TEMPLE MOUNT, OLD CITY INCLUDING STEPHENS GATE & THE MONASTERY OF ST. STEPHEN: Today we enjoy an orientation tour of the City of David including a drive around walls of the Old City of Jerusalem. We will have an opportunity to visit the first century scale model of the City of Jerusalem, describing the city more as it would have been known during Jesus' time.

Next, we will tour the site of the City of David. After lunch our walking tour of the Old City will orient us to the four quarters: Armenian, Christian, Jewish, and Moslem. We will visit Stephen's Gate, so named because, according to some traditions, St. Stephen was martyred near there. It is also called Lion's Gate, because of the four lions that decorate it on the outside. We will visit the French Dominican monastery of St Stephen, on the spot where it is believed that St Stephen was stoned to death.

Afterwards, we take some time in the Old City to visit the Western or Wailing Wall and the Dome of the Rock, with of course plenty of time to meander in the shops. We return to our accommodations for dinner and the evening. (B, L, D)

TUE, NOV 9, DAY 9: JERUSALEM: JERICHO, QUMRAN, THE DEAD SEA, MASADA & BETHANY: This morning we board our motor coach for a visit to Jericho, where we will visit the ruins of the city. After enjoying a hearty lunch at a local restaurant, we make our way to Qumran, site of the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Next, we visit the Dead Sea, and later we will travel to our final stop of the day, Masada, King Herod's impregnable fortress, where Jewish zealots defied the Romans in 70 A.D. As we make our way back to Jerusalem, we stop first to visit Bethany ('house of figs'). Here we will see the church built near the tomb of Lazarus, which we visit. (Matt 26: 1-13). Time permitting we will visit the church of St. Mary Magdalene. We return to Jerusalem for dinner and the evening. (B, L, D)

WED, NOV 10, DAY 10: JERUSALEM: ABU GOSH, LATRUN, JOPPA, CAESAREA, CARMEL CAVES: Our first stop of the day is at Abu Gosh, where we recall the disciples' post-Resurrection recognition of Christ in the breaking of the bread. We will also visit the Benedictine Monastery at Latrun.

We continue on to Joppa where Peter lodged with Simon the Tanner, and during his stay-through the power of the Holy Spirit-Peter raised Tabitha from the dead. In Joppa, Peter received his vision which led him to respond to Cornelius' invitation to come to Caesarea-the very vision which led to the decision to open Christianity to the Gentiles. We will follow Peter's path to Casearea, where he was imprisoned.

Our day concludes at the Valley of the Caves, some 15 miles south of the city of Haifa, also known popularly as the Carmel Caves. The Prophet Elijah is believed to have lived in two of the caves here. We will visit Haifa and later return to Jerusalem for dinner and the evening. (B, D)

THU, NOV 11, DAY 11: JERUSALEM: STATIONS OF THE CROSS AND THE CHURCH OF THE HOLY SEPULCHRE: We begin the day early in the Old City to follow the Via Dolorosa in praying the Stations of the Cross the traditional path followed by Jesus to his crucifixion. We will then visit the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and have the opportunity to visit the archaeological dig beneath the Church. The rest of the day will be an opportunity to explore Jerusalem on our own with time for meditation and/or shopping. This evening we gather together for a farewell dinner. (B, D)

FRI, NOV 12, DAY 12: RETURN USA: This morning we transfer to the airport for our return flight to the USA. (B)

Note: While no changes are anticipated, there may be unforeseen occasions when certain alterations become necessary to this itinerary, either due to changes in airline schedules or for other reasons.
